Meeting was opened with prayer by Rev. Paul Rankin. Minutes from the February 20, 2020 meeting were read. Jim McGee made the motion to approve the minutes as read and Hazel Norwood seconded. Session approved.

Operation Reach-Out Update

A few weeks ago, Operation Reach-Out held their *Annual Board Meeting & Volunteer Appreciation Night.* Even now Walkersville EPC continues to support Operation Reach-Out by providing lunch on the second Wednesday of each month to about 25 or 30 individuals. Operation Reach-Out is not a 'walk-in' program, but rather everyone who receives support is referred by a social service agency then screened and becomes an 'official' participant in the program.

Here is 2019 By the Numbers:

1226 clients assisted 47,337 lbs. of food distributed 817 pieces of household/furniture given 53 clients were provided beds 73 uniform shirts were purchased for Monroe Middle \$30,746.81 in financial assistance given 521 showers taken 278 loads of laundry 4553 daily lunches served 53 clients received dental care from Dental Bus <u>Yearly Projects</u>:

- > Pot Luck Drive (to collect pots, pans, and other kitchen items in March)
- > Throw in the Towel (to collect towels, washcloths, and linens in October
- Non-perishable food drives held in the spring and winter months to help keep our pantries stocked
- Collection of hygiene items: We utilize 'hotel' size items in our shower room and full-size hygiene items to be given out with our food boxes (soap, body wash, deodorant, toothpaste, toothbrush, etc.)

2020 Programs & Services:

- > Daily bible Study & Lunch (in partnership with local churches, restaurants, and individuals)
- Financial assistance for those in crisis (utilities, medication, gasoline/kerosene, emergency hotel stays)
- > Welcome Home Program to supply beds, furniture, and household items
- > Joseph's Pantry (to provide emergency food boxes and monthly food for the elderly)
- Clothing Closet

- > Partnership with area schools to help provide uniforms and needed items for low income children
- Partnership with Tent City Ministry to assist those with no fixed address to utilize shower and laundry facilities, and obtain free haircuts each month
- > NC Baptist Men's Dental Bus (provide free dental care to our community)

The Empty Tomb by Linda Goodman, copyright 1995

I am the woman called Mary Magdelene. My beginnings were humble -- some would even say shameful.

I was born in the town of Magdala, which is on the western shore of the Sea of Galilee. I never knew my mother. I was told that she was possessed by a demon who made her life such a misery that she threw herself to the bottom of a well grown dry. Her broken neck ended both her life and her memory. Because of her shameful death, no one would speak her name. Because she was denied a proper burial, there was not even a grave for me to visit.

I was raised by my grandmother for the first four years of my life. She blamed me for the death of her daughter. The demon had not bothered my mother until I was heavy in her belly, and my grandmother swore that the seed from my unknown father had been its host. "You are despised!" she would scream at me. After her death, I was turned out into the streets to fend for myself. No one dared to take me in. Alone and scared, I lived like an animal. I learned to snatch morsels from food stalls. I wrestled bones from dogs. When others threw out the scraps from their tables, I was waiting. At night I would sneak into stables to sleep, making sure to wake up early so that I would not be found and kicked into the streets.

I would watch the other children walking hand in hand with their mothers. More than anything I wanted someone to love me. I wanted to feel strong comforting arms around me, stoking my hair as I was rocked to sleep. But there was no love for me, no kindness. I was an object of hatred and scorn. In time my heart grew as hard as the stones that bruised my bare feet.

When I was twelve years old, a woman approached me. She wore fine robes of gold and purple, and her lips and cheeks were painted crimson. "Come with me," she ordered. I followed her because I did not know what else to do. She took me to a great house that was filled with women and men doing unspeakable things. I hesitated, but she gently took my hand and led me into another room. There she drew me a bath and scrubbed my skin and hair. "Now, my pretty one, you shall no longer live such a mean existence," she said in a voice that dripped with honey. "There is much more in store for you." She handed me a glass and I looked at my reflection within and saw that what she said was true. I was indeed a very pretty girl -- a very pretty young woman.

"You can have anything you want," she purred, "jewels, fine clothes, sweet perfume." I looked at her and said, "Tell me what I must do."

"You need do nothing," she whispered. "Only give you soul to the demons. They will do all that needs be done. All you need do is reap the benefits."

I did as she said. I asked the demons to enter my body. I felt their power and their strength as they made their home within my heart. For the first time in my life.... *I smiled*.

Fear by Layne Dewlen

Like so many boys of my generation, I had a fascination with the Lone Ranger, the Cisco Kid, and airplanes. For me the latter became foremost, needless to say.

When I was eight years old for some reason my dad decided to take the family for an airplane ride, I never thought when I got older to ask him why. Anyway, off to the local airport the four of us went, my father, mother, (stating you were never going to get her in an airplane), my sister who was twenty months my junior, and me. The plane was a Piper Cruiser, a small four place aircraft which I remember vividly. As we were getting into the plane my mother decided that if anything happened to us, she wouldn't want to be left behind, so she decided to go as well. Now we had a woman pilot as well as the four of us in a four-place aircraft, and somehow that little plane was able to struggle into the air. What an experience! That was when airplanes became number one in my parade.

I never had fear of flying. There were a couple of other times when I was able to fly in an airplane as I was growing up, I even won a ride in a contest, the only thing I've ever won, and I never had a twinge of fear. Later, when I started flying lessons, I had no fear, it was all excitement, then to have a job where they paid me to go up in the air.... well, for me it was "the living end," as the saying went. However, there was that one night.....it was the strangest thing.....it threw me for a loop.

We had been flying all day, nothing out of the ordinary. I was a four-year co-pilot on a trip which I had made a number of times before. The captain was one with which I had flown any number of times. We ended up in Islip, NY for the night, and was taken to the motel to spend the night, as had happened on every other trip. It had been a totally normal day. I got into bed and was getting to that point where sleep was about to take over when out of nowhere, **fear** hit me like I had never had before. The strangest part of it all was, it was a fear of flying!! **There was no way I was getting on that airplane in the morning!** I wish I could tell you the overpowering feeling of fear that came over me that night. I tried to think about it using some common sense which didn't work, nothing worked. I was gripped totally with this terrible feeling of **fear**!

Thank God for parents who instilled in me spiritual truths. I came to realize, when all my thinking and reasoning didn't work, that the fear must be from Satan. I got out of bed and knelt beside the bed and started praying for all I was worth! I rebuked Satan in the name of Jesus, I asked the Lord to cast out the fear from my mind, and something my folks had taught me, I plead for the blood of Christ to cover my mind and protect me from the attacks of the enemy. After praying for some time, that horrible fear left. I got back into bed and went to sleep. I feel the touch of hands so kind and tender, They're leading me in paths that I must trod. I'll have no fear for Jesus walks beside me, For I'm sheltered in the arms of God. So, let the storm rage high, the dark clouds rise, They won't worry me, for I'm sheltered in the arms of God. He walks with me, and naught of earth shall harm me, For I'm sheltered in the arms of God. The world is in turmoil and overriding fear. This writer believes it is only going to get worse until Jesus comes to take us Home. But!!! we have no reason to fear, we are sheltered in the arms of God and the Devil can do us no harm!!
