A note from the pastor:

Who is God?

This is one of the most basic questions that we need to consider. We know we cannot completely describe or understand God. But the more we dwell on who God is, the more we will understand ourselves and our own identity since we have been made in the image of God.

Obviousley there are numerous passages throughout the Bible that help us answer this questions. As we make our way toward the Lenten season and the apex of the Christian life, Easter Sunday, this is what we will take a little time to study in February.

Isaiah 44:6-8 tell us that there is only one true God. This is not a popular thought in our world today, and it was equally unpopular in Isaiah's time. As the same time, these verses tell us about God's sovereignty, his eternal nautre, and the fact that God stands outside of time, actually controlling it, already knowing the future.



Deuteronomy 4:15-20 and John 4:24 remind us that God is Spirit and this is how we are to worship him. There is no form or object that will heighten our worship. To our five senses there is not much to experience. How are we to worship a God that we cannot see? As both the Old and New Testaments bring out, God is very much among us.

Leviticus 19:2, Isaiah 6:3, and Revelations 4:8 are a few of the passages that point to the holiness of God. What does it mean to be holy? We are supposed to be holy because God is holy. What does that mean for us as individuals? And for the Church?

If we are talking about who God is, you knew it was coming. Out God is a God of relationship. From Genesis through Revelation we can find the statement, "I will be your God and you will be my people" at least thirty times. This is a statement of relationship as well as an opportunity to consider who God is along with who we are within the context of this relationship. What does God really desire? Revelation 21:3 gives us a glimpse of the God of relationship. If it is important to God, it needs to be important to us.

It all starts at our Ground 40 Farm. This is where, for one month, our men get the chance to disconnect, and solely focus on their sobriety and relationship with the Lord, free of all noise and distractions.

After the farm, the men move on to our second stage, the Ground 40 Ranch. For 5 months, at the ranch, the men get the chance to begin community service,

outreach, work on getting a job, and restoring broken relationships.

Lastly, once our men graduate from our free, 6 month program, they then have the opportunity to move into one of our transitional homes. This is where they get the chance to live on their own, while still having accountability, working, and being back in the community.
