A note from the pastor...

Be still, and know that I am God; I will be exalted among the nations, I will be exalted in the earth. (Psalm 46:10)

Psalm 46 talks about God's presence and protection. This particular verse has given many assurances and peace, especially during times of uncertainty, making these words particularly strong in the days we live in. When the news causes fear, anxiety, divisions, and conflicts among us as followers of Jesus Christ, it is because we have forgotten the greater reality of who God is and his presence among us. We have forgotten what God has done in and through each of us as a follower of Christ. We forget that God's power fills us. We forget that we live under God's authority, not the worlds.

However, if we point these words inwardly toward ourselves, we miss the point. As is continually the case, *it's not about us!* We must remember what matters most. It's not that we experience peace in a messed-up world. It's not that we can somehow stand outside of the world's problems and give a sigh of relief. What matters most is that God is exalted. In those last two lines, "I will be *exalted...*," the verb is an imperative. This is actually a command from God. Perhaps to read those lines correctly we need to strongly emphasize "will": "I *WILL* be exalted..."

When we remember to be still, living in firm confidence of God's power and authority we will be able to exalt the true and living God of all creation. This world that wants us to live under its power and authority, leading only to fear, uncertainty, and conflict, and we have seen plenty of that in the past several years. God expects us to live under his power and authority, leading to joy, peace, confidence, and assurance.

In March, as we enter into the season of Lent, we are able to focus on the power and authority of our God when we see him at work through the cross and the empty tomb. The sermon passages for this season begin with holy week as the Gospel of John records it. We will walk alongside Jesus through these passages, able to be still and know that God is at work, ultimately knowing that he is exalted among the nations, and especially here at Walkersville EPC.

OH, NO! By Layne Dewlen

March, 2022. Seems impossible. I will be another year older this month. Suddenly, 81 doesn't seem so old anymore. What happened, where did the time go? I don't feel any older on the inside, you know, that part the Bible calls the soul. It's really kind of strange how one part of you feels exactly the same as you did at 20, and another part of you can't keep up with the 20 year old thinking. I guess what I'm trying to say is, "the spirit is willing, but the flesh is weak."

Time marches on. The other day I was thinking about the rapture of the saints, and the second coming of Christ, when my mind went back to a watchnight service I attended. (A watchnight service, for those who don't know, is a service on new years eve that started around 10 or 10:30PM, and went until after midnight.) Anyway, I remembered how I thought that night that Jesus might come in the new year. The remembrance was very vivid in my mind, and I started trying to figure just when it was, then it hit me, it was Dec.1960, over sixty years ago. I was 19 years old.

Now I must say that my perspective of what that great day will hold has changed through the years. Back when I was young the overriding thought was the perfection His second coming would bring. There would be nothing but truth, righteous government, and real justice. Now, it's more in line with my new body...with hair. However, the imminence of His return hasn't wavered in my spirit, unless it has gotten stronger. We are just that much closer to the day! Back in 1960 there really wasn't a lot of biblical signs happening. Today, they are everywhere. Prophecy teachers use the word "convergence" for what we see today. The signs are all converging together at the same time. As one person put it, the world isn't falling to pieces, the pieces are all falling into place! He's coming, He said He would, He's coming back again! Be ready, be watchful, for we know not the day or the hour of His coming, but it is sooo soon! (Matt.25:13)

One of the things that has always made me wonder about the unsaved thinking is this very fact of their souls not feeling older. As those who are unsaved become older and have the same thoughts I have mentioned, how can they not understand there is a part of them that doesn't grow old, and will live forever? And, if they will live forever, where will that be? Then there are those who say that this life is all there is, death is the end-all. Why don't they see, maybe I should say feel, or understand that they are not getting older inside? Something inside them doesn't change. Do they not wonder why that is?

To me this part of humans that stays young no matter the years we live is a God sign to us, along with our conscience. Certainly the unsaved will have no excuse when they stand before God at the Great White Throne judgment. These two things along with the wonders of creation, including the universe, will be convicting enough.

There's an old invitational hymn we used to sing that says, "There's a great day coming, a great day coming, there's a great day coming by and by, when the saints and the sinners shall be parted right and left, are you ready for that day to come?" BE READY! Do all you can to make sure your loved ones, friends, and neighbors are ready as well.
