# A Note from the Pastor...

Here it is a new year and I realize I have been at Walkersville EPC for about seven months. During that time, among other things, I have kept track of the weekly and monthly flow of the activity of the church. With that in mind, I have adopted a somewhat less traditional schedule. Many pastors take Monday off after the responsibilities associated with worshiping on Sunday (however, I don't *have* to preach, I *get* to preach!). I have also had certain things happen on Sunday that I wanted to follow up with on Monday. At the same time, Monday has its own set of activities including Children's Choir and the occasional evening meeting. As a result, I am taking Fridays off since not much generally happens on Fridays (but also realizing pastors are always "on call"). So, with all that, here is my schedule, which is always subject to change:

Sunday: Sunday School, Worship Service, once/month Game Day, other events that come up

Monday: In the office most, or all, of the day. Tuesday: In the office most, or all, of the day. Wednesday: In the office in the morning.

Visiting, Bible Studies, Prayer Group, and Choir the rest of the day

Thursday: A mix of office time and visiting ("in and out all day")

Friday: Off.

Saturday: A couple of hours in the church, the remainder of the day off.

Now then, as to proclaiming the Word of God, we have been in the Old Testament for quite some time, going through Exodus followed by several Advent passages from Isaiah. So, as we begin the new year, we also begin the ministry of Jesus Christ, whose birth we have just celebrated, as it has been given to us in the Gospel According to Mark, starting with the baptism of Jesus. After this Jesus calls some disciples to follow him, realizing that this call extends to us today. Jesus then shows his power and authority over evil. Of course, this is just getting started and it won't be very long until we find ourselves heading to Ash Wednesday, Lent, Good Friday, and finally the greatest day of all, Easter. Here we go, ready or not!

#### The Instruments of Faith

We have come to the end of my musings on corollaries of faith and flying. In actuality I was going to do this article at the first, but it seemed the Holy Spirit had different ideas.

Up, up the long, delirious, burning blue
I've topped the windswept heights with easy grace
Where never lark, or even eagle flew.
And, while with silent, lifting mind I've trod
The high trespassed sanctity of space,
Put out my hand, and touched the face of God.

Beautiful, isn't it? Don't you want to experience it? This poem is about the end result, having nothing to do with the blood, tears, and work of training it took to get to that point. So, it is in the walk of faith, but the end result makes all the difficulties worth it. Praise God! Let's look at some of the things God has given to us for our walk of faith.

First in flying and in faith you must have a compass. In the faith walk it's your God-given, and purified conscience. Next is a map. Without a map you have no idea what dangers to flying may be on your path of flight, and the same for the walk of faith.
