# A note from the pastor...

Unlike the disciples, we know how the story ends. Through all of life's twists and turns, we are able to hang onto the hope we have in Jesus Christ in a way the disciples could not have imagined until they also arrived at the resurrection. When we enter into Revelation, we get to "peak behind the curtain" and see even more of how the story ends.

What is the best, most meaningful, most Spirit-filled worship service you have ever attended? Sunday morning? A revival? A believer's funeral? However good it was, the worship of Revelation 4 provides a picture of the most incredible worship...ever. Every detail, every participant, every word, and every action are completely focused on the One seated on the throne.

In Revelation 5 this extraordinary worship service continues with the arrival of the Lion of the tribe of Judah, the Root of David...except that it is the Lamb who has been slain. This Lamb alone is worthy to take the scroll that no one "in heaven or on earth or under the earth" was able to open. Now not only are the worship participants present but the choir shows up to continue the worship in the form of "myriads of myriads and thousands of thousands" singing the praises of the Lamb and the One seated on the throne.

In Revelation 6 the atmosphere changes dramatically so that we are able to focus on those who have been killed because of the message they had given. They are under the altar, because they themselves had been, as it were, sacrificed. The Apostle Paul describes himself in this same way in 2 Timothy 4:6 when he says, "As for me, I am already being poured out as a libation, and time of my departure has come." Judgment is coming, but not until after more will be killed for their witness to the Word of God. If this time is describing us today, are we ready?

Finally, just before we make our way into Holy Week, John hears a message that he is not to write down and we are left wondering what was said. We meet an amazing angel in Revelation 10 who has a scroll that John is to eat. The message on the scroll will be for all the earth, along with the sobering announcement, "There will be no more delay." The scroll will be sweet in his mouth and bitter in his stomach. This part of John's vision recalls another prophet's experience in Ezekiel 2-3. This message contains a mixture of joy and pain announcing the blessings and judgments of God. We are also taken back to Jesus' birth in Luke 2:34-35: "This child is destined for the falling and rising of many in Israel and to be a sign that will be opposed so that the inner thoughts of many will be revealed...," a mixture of joy and pain.

In the same way we move ahead in this Lenten season and draw closer to the Lamb who was slain for each of us.
