# A note from the pastor...

As we begin another new year, we are a people who constantly need to be reminded of who we are in Christ as well as what is to be true of us as we follow the commands and example of Christ. As usual, I go back to my favorite word: relationship. What makes us (hopefully) stand out in this world is our Christ-centered confidence and unity. With that in mind, we will be considering passages that focus on the kind of work and people we are to be.

In Joshua 1:6-9, the Israelites, led by Joshua, are about to enter into Canaan. God commands Joshua to be faithful to His Word in order to be successful. The question for us is: successful at what?

As we read through Psalm 46, we hear about the uncertainties of this world. "...though the earth should change...though the mountains shake in the heart of the sea...The nations are in an uproar, the kingdoms totter..." The greater reality of God's faithfulness is his "refuge and strength", that "the LORD of hosts is with us". Ultimately, we arrive at the familiar verse: "Be still, and know that I am God! I am exalted among the nations; I am exalted in the earth." Somebody should put that on the back of a t-shirt!

As Peter writes to persecuted Christians (and to us) he not only writes to encourage, but also presents the wondrous truths that every Christian is able to hold onto. The result here, which is the same throughout the entire Bible, is that this would "result in praise and glory and honor when Jesus Christ is revealed" allowing us to "rejoice with an indescribable and glorious joy."

Do we long for God's presence? Does our soul thirst for the living God? When life isn't fair and people ask, "Where is your God?", is God ever very far away? Psalm 42 helps us consider these questions.

Do you have a resumé? Did you boast on it? You are supposed to! On our Christian resumé perhaps the first item should be "hope". After hope should be "suffering", followed by endurance and character, circling back around to hope. This is the Apostle Paul's message at the beginning of Romans 5.

The realities found in these passages go deeper than the events of this world or the circumstances of our lives. No matter what is happening in our lives right now or ahead in 2023, God is always present and is always bigger.
