A Note from Pastor Paul:

I wonder how many husbands have heard these, or similar, words:

"How could you miss it?! It was right in front of you."

When we encounter the religious leaders of Jesus' day throughout the Gospels, we can easily ask the same question. As they are eyewitnesses of the teaching and miracles of Jesus, how could they not see him for who he was? He was right there in front of them.

As we see two sons, one seemingly insubordinate and the other seemingly obedient, only one of them ends up getting it right. Jesus' parable in Matthew 21: 28-32 explains this poignantly, setting the ministry of John the Baptist in front of them. How could they miss it? It was right there in front of them.

As Jesus relates the events of the parable in Matthew 21: 33-42, he reaches into the Old Testament, using images from the Psalms alongside how God's prophets were treated. The religious leadership realized what Jesus was saying when he talked about the wicked tenant farmers, actually talking about what was going to happen to him on the cross. How could they miss it? It was right in front of them.

For the original audience, the parable of the king giving a wedding banquet for his son in Matthew 22: 1-14 takes some unexpected twists and turns. From the insulting responses of the invited guests and the reaction of the king to the man who came, unprepared, Jesus points to those who should have seen him for who he was but didn't. After all, he was right there in front of them, how could they miss it?

As we close out November, the parable of the ten virgins in Matthew 25: 1-13 reminds us that if there is one command that provides a foundation as Jesus teaches about the future, it is, "Be ready." This is the message we keep hearing throughout these parables as well as every corner of the New Testament. It is right there in front of us.

Is church today listening? In this church, we come face to face with Jesus in Bible Studies, Sunday School, VBS, Little Angles, The Outsiders, Seniors' Lunch, and worship services (to name a few). Christ is right there in front of us. Do we see him for who he is? Are we ready to stand before him? Are we helping others see Christ right there in front of us?


