## A Note from the Pastor...

As Debbie and I have enjoyed receiving Christmas cards there was one from a family we know who live in another state. In their letter, among other parts of their lives, they described their church. It seems there are people who have strong enough opinions that factions have developed within the church.

My guess is that those opinions were centered around political interests and coronavirus debates. I was saddened and a little disturbed. This was their church. Factions and divisions should not exist in the Body of Christ, but we know they do. That is why throughout Paul's letters, one of the consistent themes is Christian unity. The fact that this reality continues should sadden us.

At the same time, I found this disturbing. This could happen within any church, anywhere. It could easily happen here at Walkersville EPC. We should not assume it won't happen here. What can we do about it?

In a word...humility. In Philippians 2:3-4 Paul says,

Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility regard others as better than yourselves. Let each of you look not to your own interests, but to the interests of others.

We are certainly entitled to our opinions...but...within the Body of Christ our focus is always to be on the interests of others. Christ-centered humility embodies compassion, mercy, grace, and, above all, love (see Philippians 2:5-8). When we respond with compassion and love, *especially* toward those we disagree with, this is humility.

Please be in prayer as you consider the Body of Christ. We all need to consider our words, actions, and opinions. Are they more likely to create unity or division? Responding with humility will often require deliberate action on our part. It does *not* come naturally and none of us are perfect. This is at the center of Jesus' command in John 13:34-35:

I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

*"Just as I have loved you..."*

This kind of love requires humility and sacrifice.

This kind of love fills the Body of Christ with unity...and the world will notice.

"...the LORD sits enthroned as King forever." (Psalm 29:10)

### **PERSEVERANCE**

As I was thinking about the future the other day, and the uncertainties of the new year, I was brought to something that happened to me when I was 14 that taught me a lesson I've never forgotten. I think it will be good to tell it at this juncture of our lives.

When I was in the 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade, living in Indianapolis, I was a crossing guard for the kids going and coming from school. Ralph Waldo Emerson, School 58 had three main thoroughfares with five crossing streets where the guards had to stand. I'm sure you've seen them in times past with the white belt that went around your middle and over one shoulder with a big silvery badge on it. Well, one of those boys was me. When I started at the beginning of my 7<sup>th</sup> grade, the man in charge talked to all of us, giving us instructions in how we were to act and being cognizant of safety at all times. I don't remember anything he said now except he mentioned how there was a lapel pin which we could get, a copy of our badge, if we did something outstanding in safety. I don't mind telling you, that made a big impression on me. I wanted one.

The 7<sup>th</sup> grade passed with no chance for me to be a hero. The 8<sup>th</sup> grade, it seemed, was going to be a repeat of the year before. Then, with only a couple of weeks left in the school year, we moved to another house out of the school's district. I could have continued as a guard, but with difficulty, so I told the teacher I was quitting.

At the Awards Day that year the school decided to give all the guards the pin because we had such a great safety record. The man in charge told me he didn't feel it would be right for them to give me one, since I had quit.

Needless to say, that incident in my life made a lasting impression, not to give up. We are facing life struggles we have never seen before, spiritually, physically, even in our daily lives. WE ARE ALMOST HOME! DON'T GIVE UP! THE AWARDS DAY IS ALMOST HERE, PRAISE GOD!

As you know, songs mean so much to me, and there is an old song's chorus that fits in so well right here. "It will be worth it all, when we see Jesus. Life's trials will seem so small, when we see Christ. One glimpse of His dear face, all sorrows will erase. So, let us run the race, till we see Christ."
