A note from the pastor...

This is an exciting (and busy) time of the year. As we approach Holy Week, starting with Palm Sunday, we walk along with Jesus and his disciples to the cross and arrive at the empty tomb. When we begin to consider that Jesus not only takes us on his final journey to Jerusalem, but also the final road to a new heaven and earth we are to heed one primary command: *be ready*.

On Palm Sunday we not only join those who welcomed their king riding on a donkey, but in Revelation 7:9-10 there is another great multitude lifting up praise to the One seated on the throne and to the Lamb.

Within the events described in Revelation 19, everyone will find themselves at one of two banquets. Some are invited to the marriage banquet of the Lamb. However, there is another banquet to which all the birds have been invited to "gather for the great banquet of God" following the final battle between the armies of heaven and the armies of the Beast.

The only reason we have hope in this life is because of the hope we have in the next. The Lamb who was slain continues to be worthy of the praise of all creation because he has defeated the powers of sin and death. When we arrive on Easter Sunday, Revelation 21 & 22 give us the ultimate hope we have in a living Jesus Christ who brings about a new creation, both in a new Jerusalem as well as within all who have put their faith in him. Along with this new creation we have the sure and certain promise that Jesus Christ is returning.

Finally, on April 30 we move to Psalm 116 to answer the question, "How can I repay the LORD for all his goodness to me?" This is a particularly wonderful question to ponder when we consider the LORD's goodness at our times of greatest need.

I always like to make the request that of all the Sundays to make sure you make it to worship our God, it's when I am not there. This is the case when Debbie and I are in North Dakota for Sarah's wedding. On April 16 Jack Roylston will use Psalm 148 as his text and on April 23 Zachary Leach will be preaching from Isaiah 40. Jack and Zachary are both students at Reformed Theological Seminary, please be an encouragement to them!
