A note from the pastor...

Of all the various aspects of the Christian life, one of the most important is prayer. If you're reading this article, you probably agree on how essential prayer is for us. The Bible talks about prayer constantly and has numerous examples of prayer. How important is prayer to your personal, individual life? Do you pray? Why is something so vital also something that many people actually fear if it means praying out loud, with and for other people?

In July and August, we will be looking at the overall topic of prayer to see what we can learn. Jesus knows the power of prayer from a heavenly perspective that we can only imagine. In Matthew 6:5-8 how and where we pray along with the words that make up our prayers are not as important as simply taking time to pray honestly, expressing what is really on our hearts. At the same time, in Matthew 6:8 it says that our heavenly Father knows what we need before we ask him. So why bother praying at all? We will consider that question on July 3.

In Luke 18 Jesus speaks on our perseverance while we are praying. Prayer should never be considered a "one and done" event. We may pray for a person or situation for weeks or years! And on the following week, in Mark 10, Jesus asks what I like to call my "prayer question": "What do you want me to do for you?" Jesus wants each of us to look him in the eye and answer that question as we pray.

The Apostle Paul lets the Ephesians, as well as you and me, know how he prays for them. It may not be what you and I would normally consider in our prayers, but it is one of the most foundational thoughts about prayer that any of us can possibly have.

How are any of us able to pray with confidence? Do your prayers even get past the ceiling? Hebrews 4:14-16 lets us know the answer. The power and effectiveness of our prayers are not based on us saying the right words, but on Jesus, our High Priest.

In all of this my prayer is that we all would be encouraged to approach prayer from some of the same attitudes we see in the Bible: joy, tears, anger, excitement, expectation, stubbornness, confusion, fear, need, peace, calm, patience, and so on. My prayer is that, as a congregation, we might gain a reputation for being "people of prayer".

Strange isn't it. We think so highly of ourselves, believing we have it altogether. "After all, I've been a Christian for ___ years, (you fill in the blank), and I know what it's all about." Then there are those times when God, in caring love, taps us on the shoulder and shows us we still have a lot of growing to do. Of course, the growing won't end until the Lord calls us home, the perfection of each of us will be complete, and the Holy Spirit's job will have been finished in us. I'm so thankful our God who made all that we see and don't see, knows when the sparrow falls, even knows when I lose another hair from my head, cares enough about ME to correct me, and shows me where I need more work in my walk with Him. Things of this world can get a hold on us without our realizing it, I'm speaking from experience, needless to say. I do believe the Lord is calling us to let loose of things of this world, and be ready for the very soon rapture of the redeemed.

Think back to the story of Lot in Gen. 19. The part of the story that intrigues me at this juncture of our perusing is Lot's wife. She was warned of what was coming, warned not to look back, but something in the city had a hold on her and she looked back....forever! I'm sure you see the correlation. Scripture is warning us of the very soon call of Christ for us to meet Him in the air to go where He is, the place He has prepared for us, Heaven. Oh, Lord, may it be so in all of our hearts today. Search us oh God, and know our hearts today.
Show us anything of this world that has a hold on us, and help us to be willing to let go and cling more
