A Note from the Pastor...

The summer is generally seen as a time to have a change of pace from the rest of the year. I want to give this summer a title: The Summer of Faith. Hebrews 11 is sometimes called the “faith chapter”. The people mentioned throughout this chapter are examples of what it means to live by faith.

What difference does faith make in our lives? We use the word “faith” regularly in the teaching and preaching of the church. We readily agree with its importance. But what does it actually mean to live out our faith in the world in which we live?

We can attempt to meet our societal challenges with faith in people and causes, but we consistently see how ineffective that is. We are able to have faith in science and data, but that is a shallow faith. We run into any number of people who have differences of opinion (and *everyone* seems to have the data to prove their opinion is correct!!). They can’t all be right! How do we react? When it’s all said and done, where have you placed your faith?

Our faith comes from a source that is more powerful than any earthly or manmade source. When we place our faith in the only living and true God, it changes everything. Faith unifies us and draws us closer to God. A Godly faith provides strength when everything around us seems to be falling apart.

The first three verses of Hebrews 11 cover an enormous range of spiritual reality. They take us from Creation to the hope we have of eternal life through Jesus Christ. They tell us that, whether we see it or not, the spiritual world is very real.

In June we will begin to answer some of the questions of faith by looking at the lives of Abel, Enoch, Noah, and Abraham. These men had a faith in God before they knew they were supposed to have a faith in God. Throughout the rest of the summer, we will also take a look into the faith of Sarah, Jacob, Joseph, Moses, Gideon, and Samson. In the end we will see that, through faith in God, people are used by God. That message travels from the lives of these men and women into our lives today. Through our faith in God, we also are used by God and stand shoulder to shoulder with these Hebrews 11 people in the work of the Kingdom of God.
