The next afternoon, Brother Lee and Brother Allen invited those boys to go to the baseball field with them and play some catch. All three of them went. When they got back home in the late afternoon, they looked tired and happy at the same time.

That evening, I asked Brother Allen what the boys' names were. He said, "Tommy, Danny, and Mikey."

Trying not to appear too inquisitive, I asked, "Which one is the youngest?"

"That would be Mikey, and he's too little to play baseball," Brother Allen complained. Suddenly his eyebrows shot up and he said, "Wait a minute. Are you in love with Mikey?"

"I am not in love with nobody but Jesus," I insisted. But that was a lie.

The next morning as I was walking to school, I saw Mikey, walking all by himself. I ran to catch up with him.

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“Hi, Mikey. I’m Linda,” I told him breathlessly. “Why are you walking by yourself when you’ve got two brothers?”

“They think I’m too little to walk with them. I can’t keep up,” he explained, then asked, “How do you know my name?”

Suddenly, I stopped. I remembered that colds are contagious, and I could not bear the thought of cute little Mikey, my almost boyfriend, getting sick because of me. I started walking to school at my regular pace. That kiss would just have to wait.

Imagine my shock when I realized that Mikey had stopped running. He wasn’t even walking. He was standing still, waiting for me.

“You give up too soon,” he told me.

The problem was there was nothing to stop two kids six and five years old from falling off the end twelve feet to the brick ally below! Did I say we were well behaved?) Back to the story, Layne. One other thing about Mother was we were never allowed water, candy, cookies, crayons, or toys when we went to church. You were to go to the bathroom and get a drink if you wanted one before service started, and that was that! I know I'm getting a little long winded here, but stick with me.

There was a young lady about 20 years old that got saved one Sunday night. She came to think the world of my folks, my sister, and especially me! Did I say I've always been lovable? One Sunday evening before the church service she came bringing gifts to my sister and me. I don't remember what my sister received, it didn't matter then, and it doesn't really matter to me now. But my gift was MARBLES!

There were different sizes, different colors, and a cloth bag to hold them! WOW! Then it was time to go to church and leave my new pride and joy. Couldn't I take them to church just this once? Surprise, surprise, my mother said OK, but "don't you open that bag in church!" was the last words from the power that be.

A further word of background. My sister and I had to sit with Mother on the front row. It was a law; I forget which number it was. As the service progressed everything was fine with my bag of marbles and me. Then it was prayer time. I fingered the bag, I picked up the bag, and suddenly the Devil got hold of that bag and the marbles started coming out! I tried to stop them but somehow the Devil had the upper hand. Now remember this was a former theater with very slanted floors, so the marbles started rolling toward the altar, and again the Devil got into the act and caused every one of those marbles to fall into the metal cold air return in the floor, making the most horrendous noise, bang-a-ty bang, bang-a-ty bang. I thought it would never stop, and right in the middle of **prayer** time! I was so embarrassed, and worried about what was coming when we got home.

Well, I'm glad to say I escaped the guillotine, but I knew better than to ever ask to take a toy to church after that. So much for being an example!
