A note from the pastor...

At Christmas have you considered the Psalms? During these next three Sundays of Advent, as well as on Christmas day, we will consider some of the Psalms and see how they relate to the birth of Christ as well as what Christ accomplishes on our behalf. Psalm 80 is a prayer seeking Israel's restoration, but also points to our own need for 'restoration'. Within this psalm, three times the statement is made: "Restore us, O God; let your face shine, that we may be saved." We can see the fulfillment of these words in the work of our Savior, Jesus Christ.

In the passage from Psalm 85 there are some remarkable word pictures that find their meaning in our Lord. He is the God of salvation. He is the God that embodies all the descriptions and actions within these verses: peace, salvation, glory, steadfast love, faithfulness, and righteousness. Of all the images presented, perhaps verse 10 is the most vivid: "Steadfast love and faithfulness will meet; righteousness and peace will kiss each other." As we consider all the descriptions, we should also experience the presence of Christ.

Psalm 89 takes us back to the covenant God made with David in 2 Samuel 7:16, "Your house and your kingdom shall be made sure forever before me; your throne shall be established forever." The ultimate fulfillment of this covenant is seen in Jesus Christ who sits eternally on the throne of the line of David, reigning "for all generations."

There are many different contexts in which Psalm 96 can be placed. The words of this psalm take on special meaning when we read them with the birth of the Christ child in mind. We are suddenly able to see the majesty and glory of Jesus, whether he is in a manger, on a cross, or risen and living in our hearts. As we read the words of this psalm, this is not simply words on paper, this is exhilarating joy. This is worship in its truest form. And worship is what everyone who came to the manger did. So should we.

Advent is our opportunity to get ourselves ready to approach the manger of our Savior.
